SUMMARY:

I am a licensed clinical social worker, sexuality educator, and forensic evaluator working with sexuality and gender issues. I obtained a Master of Social Work with a focus on clinical practice in 2016, alongside with a Master of Education in Human Sexuality from Widener University. My training was focused on sexuality and gender issues and the clinical treatment and assessment of these topics. I have provided services in outpatient, inpatient, residential, and partial hospitalization settings. My range of clinical experience includes individual, couples, groups, and families. I received my forensic training at the Joseph J. Peters Institute through conducting court ordered evaluations of domestic batterers, juvenile sexual offenders, and adult sexual offenders. I currently am in private practice as a psychotherapist, where I provide individual, couples, and group psychotherapy services. Additionally, I have provided court testimony with an area of expertise in sexuality and custody disputes. I work with perpetrators of domestic violence, juvenile sexual offenders, adult sexual offenders, and individuals with substance abuse issues. The possession and dissemination of child sexual exploitation material, pedophilia, and paraphilias are issues I address in both civil and criminal court. Additionally, I have provided court testimony with an area of expertise in sexually deviant attraction and non-normative relationships.

- Clinical Interview of the client with a focus on their life history.
- Psychological Testing measuring cognitive, social, and behavioral functioning.
- Collateral Interviews of friends and family of the examinee.
